Encouraging the Church and making disciples: A look at our programming and audience

Challenges in carrying out the mission



New Life Radio is carrying out its calling to proclaim the Gospel to the Russian-speaking people. It is a globally-available broadcast operation using satellites, Internet, and FM radio. Despite its world wide outreach potential, the radio station incredibly is staffed by only two full time and three part time radio missionaries. These dedicated servants labor to keep our broadcasts going 24 hours a day—and with high quality! That we continue, is simply miraculous and we know the Lord is behind it! It is a privilege to

be partnering with them

Often, when a ministry is effective, it faces hardships and struggles, and our spiritual enemy has no interest in seeing the Russian people come to Christ. Indeed, Russia is still emerging from a 70 year period of enforced atheism which today has a profound impact on this nation's spiritual and cultural life.

New Life Radio came on the scene in the early 1990s, as the new Russia was emerging and there were few restrictions on developing unique endeavors like Christian radio in a land that never had it. But those early days are over, and in 2013, the evangelical Church faces numerous obstacles by government, cultural, and religious forces that even impact our little radio operation in the middle of Moscow. In our update from Moscow Station Director Dima Vatoulya will share so you can know how to pray for this radio ministry and its future service to the Lord.

WHY NLR WORKS

Take a simple goal, like Jesus' call to proclaim his Gospel to the ends of the earth, and then figure how to do it in a way that God makes possible. If "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" is the methodology given to us to employ in this great task, then it made sense to us that radio could be an effective medium to introduce the Christian life to the Russian-speaking people.

The key to this working, is dedicating all activities on the air to a clear presentation of Scripture, with all other programming following this: preaching, teaching, Christian music, and information helpful to introducing Christ, while giving meat to those seeking to become mature disciples of Christ.

New Life Radio is formatted to provide both milk and meat to whomever tunes in. NLR produces "Godspots" that are short explanations in dramatic pose that introduce basic concepts of Christianity for young people never exposed to the Gospel.

NLR grows the Church with

solid teaching from pastors like Charles Stanley, Chuck Swindoll, and Russian teachers like Peter Mitskevich, who have proven faithful to preaching God's Word effectively.

The result: people are transformed by the Spirit through the Word. They become disciples, they begin to mature, and they eventually become salt and light to a lost world as leaders in Christ's Church. That's why NLR works. Share the Word on the air, and watch the Spirit move in people's lives.

Despite our great audience potential, we never know exactly how many people we reach: that's a matter for the Spirit. We simply make the best Christian radio we know how and trust God for the results. In this way, our role in evangelism becomes part of an overall mission effort in Russia and other Slavic lands to build the Church. Thanks for your role in helping us carry out this great privilege of service to our LORD!

--NLR has been working for over 22 months to secure a new satellite broadcast license from the Russian state media agency *Roskomnadzor*, but they take no action to provide it. Pray for our license to come through, ensuring our current broadcasts on the TRICOLOR satellite.





CHALLENGES in financing the Moscow studios—thoughts from NLR Station Director Dima Vatoulya

For the past few years, NLR has experienced a shortage of resources that any radio network needs to operate properly. Our radio missionaries have done their best to overcome this, but they need help in developing new programming that can keep and attract a global audience.

Dima writes "All people at NLR work at their best, but 2 full time positions isn't enough. We need more staff, but have no way to get them. In order to attract more listeners on a regular basis we need more programs and a special social media manager for Internet. Since we can't afford it, we do everything possible ourselves. But that's not enough." Our last on air funding shareathon only brought in \$800, making it clear that our partnership with American Christians remains the basis for our continued ministry.

CRFR note: We are grateful for talented missionaries like Dima, who serves multiple roles at NLR from station manager, program director, chief engineer, computer programmer, resident theologian. NLR needs funding for music purchases, equipment replacement, petty cash for hosting on air guests (food, transportation), etc. The most basic items any radio station needs, we have trouble supplying and need your help.

THESE AND OTHER ISSUES have been on our hearts for the last few years, yet we trust our Lord to provide, as he has been faithful in the past, and his provision is sufficient. AS YOU CONSIDER what your role is, whether it be to pray for our staff, or to contribute financially, know that we have a wonderful team of radio missionaries who daily go beyond the call to ensure that the Christian message is available across the nation and globe.
